We at the Don Bosco Health Centre, Basant Road, Paharganj, observed that Traumatic Injury, Abscess, URI- Upper Respiratory Infection, and skin diseases are very commonly diagnosed by our medical consultants. Mainly street children who stay at the railway platforms or at the shelter homes of other NGOs visit here for their treatment.

Case Study

Child Name: Sinu **Age:** 12 years

Father's Name: Rati Ram Mother's Name: Kavita Devi

Address: Paharganj Market, New Delhi

Sinu is a 12-year-old boy from Bihar. He stays alone in the city without any of his family members. His parents and his siblings are living in Bihar. Sinu's parents work there as labours. He has one of his cousins residing in the city but he doesn't know where.

Sinu works at a Tea Shop in the Paharganj Market area, which is where he also resides.

Sinu misses his parents and siblings back home but says he is happy here, as well.

One fine day, Sinu developed a blister due to some reason which he doesn't seem to remember how but says, that he basically ignored it completely for quite some time. Over a course of few more days, Sinu says, the blister burst up and created more pain



and discomfort. Eventually, Sinu had no option but to get it treated or else it would become even more worse. He knew about the Don Bosco Health Centre, Paharganj and about its services, so he went over to get himself treated for the same.

There, he got his required treatment done by the Medical Team. The doctor suggested him for proper dressing on a regular basis.



Sinu was given the pain- relieving medicines as well.

Soon Sinu got cured and is thanked the Medical team of Don Bosco Health Centre for the immediate help.
