As the country grapples with the rise in Covid-19 cases, people have been forced to remain indoors during the pandemic but the worst affected are the daily wagers and other migrant communities.

The Covid 19 curfew has robbed daily wagers and migrants of their daily income. They said they have no food to feed them and their families. Many workers also wish to leave city, but are left stranded, as the railway and bus services have been suspended in the light of the pandemic.

We have distributed ration, mask and soap in the poor pockets of Delhi though our staff including the medical team. For distribution in accordance with the social distancing and government protocols we have taken the support of the volunteers and our staff who received the training on safety measures . The distributions were done in consultation with the government as to avoid duplication of the distribution of ration. The ration and sanitisation materials were given as per the need of the people. Medical team of BOSCO conducted number of awareness sessions on social distancing and safety measures.



**Through the support of Don Bosco Mondo, BOSCO supported 1710 families and the average number in a family is 4 and so we have reached over 6840 individuals.**
