





Distribution of Food kits - COVID 19 Relief Programme

As the crisis around the COVID-19 pandemic grows, the livelihoods of a large number of families surviving on daily wages have been shaken up. Zomato Feeding India provided food kits to support migrant families who live in poor pockets of Delhi and to help them have a reliable supply of meals in the absence of employment opportunities.

In the light of COVID – 19, declared pandemic by WHO led to the immediate lockdown in country. Delhi, a capital of India shares the substantial population of economic migrants in it. Preventive mechanism in the form of complete lockdown has created a concern of bread butter on daily wage labours. Stranded labour migrant population struggled with the suspension of train and bus services, these restrictions have left them with no source of income and insufficient ration in their families. With the support of community volunteers, stakeholders and local networks, BOSCO Delhi identified such areas to respond with ration kits in slum communities. Ration kits distribution was collaborative initiative of BOSCO- Delhi and Zomato Feeding India.

The main target groups are:

- Migrants, slum, daily wagers and vulnerable families
- Stranded individuals,

The kit contains the following supplies.

- 1. 10kg Atta
- 2. 3 kg Dal

However, based on the size of the family, and the food habit of the people at the target locations, the number of kits to the family were variant. **Total 3502 kits** were distributed to the vulnerable families.

Necessary permissions were secured from the authorized authorities at the respective locations, vehicle passes, police security, were also secured. Many young people came forward as volunteers for the packing and distribution of kits. They were given appropriate protection gears. Information about each individual beneficiary, as directed by the sponsors, were also recorded for documentation and reporting purposes.
